HOMESTEAD AFFIDAVIT

Under Section 2294, Revised Statutes, for settlers who cannot appear at the District Land Office.

For Cheyenne County,March 6th, 1886.I, Clark Huntington, of Cheyenne County,having filed my Homestead Application No. 9574, do solemnly swear that I amover the age of 21 years and a native
born Citizen of the United
Statesthat said application No. 9574 is made for the purpose of actual settlement and cultivation;that said entry is made for my exclusive use and benefit, and not directly or indirectly for the use or
benefit of any other person or persons whomsoever; that I amnow residing on the land I desire to enter, and that I have made a bona fide improvement and settlement
thereon; that said settlement was commenced Febry 13th 1886that my improvements consist of Frame House 12 x 16,Log Stable 14 x 12, Corral 80 x 90, One acre brook
and enclosed.and that the value of the same is \$ 150.00; that owing to Great distanceI am unable to appear at the District Land Office to make this affidavit, and that I have never before
made a homestead entry exceptSworn to and subscribed before me this Sixth day of March, 1886.Clark Huntington

NOTE.—The claimant must fill up the blank places above, showing whether he is the head of a family or over twenty-one years of age; whether a native citizen, or has declared his intention to become a citizen; whether he and his family, or some member thereof, is residing on the land, giving the date of actual settlement, describing the dwelling-house and improvements, and stating the value of the same, and stating reason for not appearing at the District Land Office. If claimant ever before made a homestead entry, describe the same; if not, draw a line over the word "except."
