Court that during his residence in the United States, he has behaved himself as a man of good moral character; attached to the Constitution on the United States, and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the same; and that he had not borne any hereditary title, or been of any of the orders of nobility in the Kingdom from whence he came. It was therefore adjudged and ordered, that the said John H. Currie be admitt ed
