Be it Remembered, That at a Term of the District Court in and for said County, holden in Harrisonburg therein, on the 16 day of April, in the year of our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred Six present the Honorable H. M. Brown, sole presiding Judge, W. H. Ingles Sheriff of said County, and L. S. Page Clerk of said Court, the following proceedings among others were had and done, to-wit: Patrick J. Swan, a native of Ireland, and at present residing within said State, appeared in open Court and made application to be admitted to become

A CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES.

And it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that he had declared on oath before Clerk of this Court of Banner a Court of record having common law jurisdiction and using a seal, at least two years before this application, that it was bona fide his intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce forever all allegiance to any foreign Prince, Potentate, State, or Sovereignty whatsoever, and particularly to the King of Britain of which he was heretofore a subject; and said applicant having declared on oath before this Court that he would support the Constitution of the United States and that he doth absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure all allegiance and fidelity to every foreign Prince, Potentate, State or Sovereignty whatsoever and particularly to the power above named; the Court being satisfied from the affidavits of said applicant and of John K. Hoke and Jacob M. Cox his witnesses, now on file, which are hereby ordered to be entered of record, and from careful inquiry of said applicant and his said witnesses in open Court, that said applicant has resided within the territory of the United States for the term of five years next preceding this application, without being at any time during the said five years out of the territory of the United States, and within this State one year at least; and it further appearing to the satisfaction of this Court in the manner aforesaid that during the time aforesaid he has behaved as a man of good moral character, attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the same, and that he does not disbelieve in and is not opposed to all organized government, and is not a member of or affiliated with any organization entertaining and teaching such disbelief in or opposition to all organized government, and does not advocate or teach the duty, necessity, or propriety of the unlawful assaulting or killing of any officer or officers, either of specific individuals or of officers generally, of the government of the United States or of any other organized government because of his or their official character, and has not violated any of the provisions of the act of Congress approved March 3, 1905, entitled "An act to regulate the immigration of aliens into the United States."

Whereupon it is Ordered by the Court, That the said Patrick J. Swan be and he is hereby admitted to become a Citizen of the United States.

Page Clerk of the Court aforesaid, do hereby certify that the above and foregoing is a true and correct copy of the proceedings of said Court in the matter of the naturalization of Patrick J. Swan and that the affidavits above referred to and each of them have been duly entered of record as required by law.
