I have no interest in this claim.  
 I have known Henry L. Beach for over 33  
 years last past. I saw him professionally in  
 the year 1891 in the fall. (I believe, 1891) He told  
 me he had been in Nebraska and had taken  
 up a claim, but he was not able to remain  
 upon it, which his condition justified him  
 in saying at the time I saw him. He had  
 a "lump" in the side over the region of the  
 liver which "broke". This abscess incapa-  
 citated him from manual labor for months, just  
 how many I can not now recall. A year or  
 so afterwards I examined him for an increase  
 in pension to which I considered him justly  
 entitled. I saw him more or less often  
 up to 1893 or latter part of 1892. I considered  
 him totally unfit for active manual labor in 1891  
 and 1892.
