B, 43rd Regiment of Indiana Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. _____ of that Regiment for the months of _____, 1861, he is reported Mustered out on Det Muster Out Roll Oct, 19th 1864 at Indianapolis, Ind as private borne on some rolls as Eliza Byrd.
