

State and Sovereignty whatsoever, and particularly to the Power of whom he was a subject, and that the said subject had resided in the United States at least five years prior next preceding his admission without at any time during the five years aforesaid, and having behaved himself in a good moral character, and attached to the Constitution of the United States, and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the same.

Whereupon, it was ordered that Julius Fisher be admitted to his admission to become a citizen of the United States. Witness my hand and seal of Kimball County this 28<sup>th</sup> day of March 1888.
