A, 47<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Mo Volunteers, to serve 6 Mos years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Private on the 29<sup>th</sup> day of Aug, 1864, at Pilot Knob, in Co. A, 47<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Mo Volunteers, to serve 6 Mos years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. A of that Regiment for the month of dated March 21<sup>st</sup>, 1865, he is reported Mustered out of Service with the  
Co on that date
