To all whom it may concern:

George, that Francis W. Coder, a Private  
 of Captain William Canolle Company (C)  
 1st Regiment of Ohio Heavy Artillery, Volunteer  
 who was enrolled on the 6th day of  
 June one thousand eight hundred and  
 thirty three to serve three years or during the  
 war, is hereby discharged from the service of  
 the United States this twenty fifth day of  
 July 1865 at Knoxville Tennessee, by order  
 of Adjutant General Department U.S.A. (No  
 objection to his being re-enlisted is known to  
 exist.) Said Francis W. Coder was born near  
 Buchanan, in the State of Ohio, is twenty  
 years of age, five feet ten inches high, light complexion,  
 gray eyes, dark hair and by occupation is now called  
 a farmer. Given at Knoxville Tennessee this twenty  
 fifth day of July 1865.
